Heal Country...

Today marks the final day of this year's NAIDOC Week. NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC is celebrated not only in Indigenous communities, but by Australians from all walks of life. Many of the activities planned locally for this week have been postponed due to the COVID situation.



I wonder if you have paused in this week to consider the experience of the First Peoples or to reflect upon the experience of the local indigenous people in our area. We live and minister on the custodial lands of the Arakwal people of the Bundjalung nation. The NAIDOC 2021 theme - Heal Country! – calls for all of us to continue to seek greater protections for our lands, our waters, sacred sites and indigenous cultural heritage from exploitation, desecration, and destruction. For the First Peoples, country is more than a place. It is inherent to their identity. Here in the Byron Shire we are privileged to live in a part of this country surrounded by God's beautiful creation. The land, the oceans, the rivers and the ranges all speak of God's glory in creation. This place holds such an important heritage for First Peoples. This week also marks 27 years since the The Uniting Church in Australia (UCA) formally entered into a covenantal relationship at the invitation of and with the Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress (UAICC). The banners in our buildings remind us of this every time we gather. As a result we are encouraged to continue to seek truth telling, justice and reconciliation for First Peoples and to engage in walking together into the future. The UCA is one of the only organisations in our country who have included First Peoples in our constitution in the preamble, which reflects the importance of this for us as God's people. Take time to reflect on these words from that preamble:

"When the churches that formed the Uniting Church arrived in Australia as part of the process of colonisation they entered a land that had been created and sustained by the Triune God they knew in Jesus Christ. Through this land God had nurtured and sustained the First Peoples of this country, the Aboriginal and Islander peoples, who continue to understand themselves to be the traditional owners and custodians (meaning 'sovereign' in the languages of the First Peoples) of these lands and waters since time immemorial. The First Peoples had already encountered the Creator God before the arrival of the colonisers; the Spirit was already in the land revealing God to the people through law, custom and ceremony. The same love and grace that was finally and fully revealed in Jesus Christ sustained the First Peoples and gave them particular insights into God's ways."

We acknowledge the Arakwal people of the Bundjalung nation, the original custodians of this place. We acknowledge their deep spiritual connection to these lands and waterways upon which we live and gather, and honour their elders past, present and emerging.
