Flipping Tables...

In John 2 we read of a remarkable event which takes place in the temple of Jerusalem. The temple was the central place of worship for all Jewish people and Jesus, from the far-off town of Nazareth, enters and makes an impact! What occurs is shocking and could be seen as Jesus inciting a riot. The scene is vividly described in the passage, filled with movement and sound and we can imagine this taking place in our mind's eye.

'Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their





One of the things that jumps out at me in this passage is where Jesus overturns the tables. He flips them over...right there in the middle of this sacred space. In so doing, many believe he was addressing the injustice perpetrated by the sellers. Jesus begins his ministry by showing the way, more than telling about it. There in the temple, Jesus disrupts and overturns the systems of corruption and profiteering that are taking place. Again and again in his ministry, Jesus shows us that his movement is about overturning systems of oppression and injustice.

As a Fair Trade faith community, we actively engage in ethical purchasing, buying Fair Trade products, as one step in addressing the unjust experience of workers around the world. In the past few weeks we have witnessed injustices related to the sexual abuse and mistreatment of women in the media. Closer to home we witness injustice daily in the experience of minority groups and rough sleepers in our community. I wonder what tables of injustice we are being asked to overturn in our lives and in this world. If we are choosing to walk in the way of Jesus this Lent, then maybe part of our calling is flipping tables! Grace and peace, Rev Phil
