
## BANGALOW/BYRON BAY UCA

#### Faith and works...



Over the past few weeks we have engaged in considering the New Testament Book of James in our worship gatherings online and now face-to-face again. The Book of James contains five chapters and we have been considering one chapter each week, as we wonder together how this part of Scripture might relate to our lives here in 2021 and beyond. I wonder what parts of the

opening few chapters have resonated with you so far?

For James, faith is living and active. It is not just a passive collection of ideas, doctrines and beliefs that we might hold onto in our minds. In James we have seen that faith is embodied and enacted as a lived experience. The faithful followers of Jesus receive God's Word and act upon it. In some sense the letter focuses on the two greatest commandments as summarised by Jesus...Love God and love your neighbour as yourself. James uses a particular approach to the structure of the letter where after a series of statements, wisdom sayings or teachings a section is concluded with a clever one-liner. Possibly the most well known example is this:

'For just as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is also dead.' - James 2:26

James challenges us to consider how we will live out our faith together in ways that reflect God's mercy and benefit the marginalised. James highlights the active display of compassion in caring for the most basic of needs of those who are without: the provision of clothing, food, shelter and safety. So where do we see faith in action in our community? Well, as I look around at our ministries in and to our local community, I am inspired by the active faith demonstrated within our own community of faith by so many people, including our volunteers. So many of our people are actively engaged in ministry and putting their faith into action. Each day there are people who are serving God and their neighbours in such beautiful ways in our community. Our ministries including Op Shop, Fair Trade Advocacy, The Severe Wet Weather Shelter, Sewing Group and Open Church are all examples of faith being put into action. But we cannot rest on these, as an active, lived faith must be part of our DNA and must continue for all of our days. My prayer is that the ongoing effects of considering these ancient writings in James will inspire and challenge us so that our faith grows to be alive and active, as we seek to continue the path of loving God and loving our neighbour.
