Blessed are the peacemakers...

It was a few weeks ago now, but I wonder if the International Day of Peace was on your radar (21st September). I appreciated reading social media posts from a range of faith leaders, many of whom joined together for ecumenical and inter-faith gatherings to acknowledge the importance of peace and humanity's deep need for it, especially in these days. I also valued our Moderator, Rev Simon Hansford's inspiring



address from an event on that day. In that address Simon wrote these powerful words:

'I have almost no time for those who would keep the peace at all costs, who close the windows and curtains so that the cries of the hungry don't disturb their evening meal. I have all the time in the world for those who will expend everything to create peace: speaking up, sitting beside, waiting with, listening to, building patiently, hopefully. The One I worship calls me to faithful service. The One I follow blesses the broken, attends to the least, places a small child in the midst of us and proclaims her worth, welcomes the outcast and the stranger. The One who calls me, challenges me to bring the greeting of peace to each home I visit, to each table to which I am invited.'

Every week in our gatherings we practice the 'Passing of the Peace.' In recent COVIDSafe times we have continued doing this, using an embodied practice that physically recognises that the peace of God that transcends all understanding resides within us and we are willing to share this peace with our community. And not only this, we are also willing to receive the peace of our community into our own lives. In a world that is filled with a pandemic, suffering, war and injustice, God's peace is so desperately needed. We are called to be a people of peace '*Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God,*' says Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5.

May we be challenged to be a community of peace, offering peace to this world not just in our words but also in our actions. May we be peacemakers in our families, in our friendships, in our communities and in our global world.
