What comes after Easter...

'Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit.' (John 20:21-22)

It was such a special time for our community to join together at three gatherings across the Easter weekend, as we remembered and reflected upon the story at the heart of our faith - the story of Christ's life, death and resurrection. This came to a powerful culmination with our sunrise gathering at Cape Byron Lighthouse, amidst the glory of God's beautiful creation and a special sunrise.

Following on from last weekend we are now in the season of Easter. This season celebrates the resurrection and ascension of Christ, along with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, concluding at Pentecost. In the Gospel of John, Jesus' first encounter with the gathered disciples following the resurrection involves the resurrected Jesus breathing on them. In this breath, much like the Ruach of God at the beginning of creation as described in Genesis, are they being offered God's Spirit as a blessing? Maybe Christ is offering the disciples, not only breath, but life in this encounter. It is an important turning point in their grief, fear and loss. Here they are not only offered life but offered it in a way which requires them to engage in it along with others. They are called and sent to pass the baton on and bless others with life in Christ's fullness.

For us, this is what comes next after Easter this year. It should be what comes next after every Easter. The impetus to engage in life in all its fullness as followers of the resurrected Christ. Jesus empowers and sends his first followers and we too are sent in the same way. Sent to minister in our families and communities. Sent to bring light and life to this world. Sent to announce the good news of Christ and God's love and welcome to all people.

As we consider what comes next this Easter may we choose to hear the call of our resurrected crucified Lord and follow in his way, the way of love.

Forest Advocacy Ministry Role Implementation Committee (FAMRIC)

Recently, Rev Phil has joined this committee which is working towards creating a ministry placement for a minister to work in forest advocacy. The trees and creatures of the forests in NSW are in crisis, following logging, the 2019/20 bushfires, the 2022 floods and the escalation of climate change. This is an opportunity to develop a Christian voice and presence in the struggle for forest protection. This proposal, initially led by the Mid North Coast Presbytery, but with a vision to work in partnership with others, is for the establishment of a Forest Advocate ministry role, starting on the Mid North Coast and expanding to the Queensland border in the north and the Hunter River in the south. Rev Phil is offering a voice from the Far North Coast on this committee. If you are interested in supporting this role financially or have any questions please ask Rev Phil.
