We are an Easter people...



One of the often heard phrases as people gather on Easter Day is the saying "He is risen!" It is often accompanied with the response "He is risen indeed!" In saying this phrase we are summing up one of the core theological ideas of the Christian faith - Jesus Christ is alive and his resurrection brings new life. Across the Easter weekend we hold two key aspects of our faith, the death of Jesus of Nazareth on a Roman cross outside Jerusalem and the resurrection of Jesus Christ and the empty tomb. I often engage in each Easter weekend as a journey, where a range of emotions can be experienced, some which we rarely engage in during our weekly worship gatherings or even often in our lives. We journey through the Easter weekend carrying the weighty and poignant story of the events of Christ's passion through Maundy

Thursday and Good Friday. A story of betrayal, rejection, suffering and death. Often, we seek to rush towards the Easter Sunday experience of celebration and resurrection and there is good reason for this! But it is also enriching to sit with the in-between experience of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. This is a time of reflection and loss, of waiting and grieving. It is a time when all hope can seem fleeting, if not lost. After all that would have been the experience of the followers of Jesus on that first Easter weekend, not knowing the enormity of what was about to unfold. It also enables us to engage with the real life experiences of suffering, grief and loss that effect us all and for some that will be their experience this Easter.

This year more than ever, as we continue to walk and live in the aftermath of the flooding disasters across the Northern Rivers the circumstances of our region and our neighbourhood, reflect this Easter narrative. Our communities have gone through an experience of 'death' and there is much heaviness, loss, waiting and grief present amongst us. There is also a sense of hope that is present and growing. We see this in the amazing response of love and support that has been such a beautiful part of this whole situation. Our communities are waiting for new life to come, for resurrection to occur. We pray that this will be the case.

And so our calling as those who proclaim and reflect on the phrase, "He is risen," is to be people of hope - an Easter people. We are people who seek to follow the way of Christ, which is the way of the cross. But we also know that this path leads to resurrection and new life.

May we walk as Easter people in the days ahead, as we seek to bring hope and new life to our own lives and to our communities. May we walk the way of love that has been so clearly demonstrated for us in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. All of which we reflect upon in this season of Easter.
