Hope...



"But we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope." (Romans 5:3-4)

In this season following our celebrations of Pentecost a fortnight ago, we continue to reflect on the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. The above passage from Romans Chapter 5 is an important reminder to us of the reality that in this life we will experience challenges and suffering. Through all of this, God's Spirit is active and working with us, within us and through us.

Paul in effect is saying that we will face suffering and this does not contradict what he has also been saying about the wonderful blessings of being a follower of Christ earlier in this letter. In fact, God works through these sufferings and brings about unforeseen and unknown blessings. We may not know in the intensity of the experience why we are facing suffering or the challenges that come our way and we may not ever know in this life why it happened that way. But we do trust that God still has a purpose, despite what is happening in our lives and that hope exists even in the midst of our experiences. As Paul says, our character will grow through such experiences, we will develop depth and perseverance. Paul suggests, that this will lead to hope and

"hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." (Romans 5:5)

Our hope is grounded in our faith in a good, wise and loving God. A God who through the Holy Spirit has poured out love into our hearts. This is a God who through the coming of the Holy Spirit now resides within us. This means that when sufferings come, God is not some distant God that is far off and unaware of our experience. We need to come back to the reality that God is present with us and most strikingly within us. This is where we can find a hope that does not disappoint. A hope that in the midst of our sufferings, God is in the thick of it with us. We have this hope as followers of Christ. A hope that we will share in his glory.

May you experience the presence of God with you whatever you are experiencing in this season and may your heart be filled with God's love.


