The Season of Creation...

How do we respond to this in a way that proactively seeks to take this responsibility seriously for ourselves and for the generations to come? The current younger generations have been extremely vocal about their growing concerns for our planet and the effects of climate change that can be seen around us. They have led the charge in reminding us of the importance of caring for God's creation. Maybe it is time for us to also hear their voices as those who will take on the mantle of responsibility into the future.

May we be open to hearing God's voice through creation during this season. May we be inspired in our recognition of God's glory demonstrated in creation and take seriously our responsibility to care for creation.

FAMRIC & Field Trip for Rev Phil

In December 2021 Rev Phil was invited to join a committee established by the Mid-North Coast Presbytery called the Forest Advocate Ministry Role Implementation Committee (FAMRIC). This is a committee working towards creating a ministry placement focused on working with environmental activists, establishing new faith communities and creating a vibrant Christian presence – prophetic, relational and pastoral – in efforts for forest protection in NSW. This role will also resource the wider church in developing material for the Season of Creation and in so doing bringing encouragement, connection and unity to the scattered church. Rev Phil's involvement is to provide a voice from the Far North Coast region, as this role's scope would extend from the QLD border to the Hunter River. On the weekend 9th-12th September, Rev Phil will be attending a Field Trip to the forests surrounding Bellingen. This will include meeting with the FAMRIC Committee, planned worship activities in the forests, visiting activists and those engaged in environmental work and joining with the local UCA for Sunday worship.



The Bangalow Christmas Tree Festival

We are now well into planning for a new event called: "The Bangalow Christmas Tree Festival". Approved by the Church Council, this event will run in an exhibition style in the Bangalow Church from 18th-23rd December. We have invited a range of community groups in the

Bangalow community to participate by designing and creating a Christmas Tree that reflects their group. These trees will be displayed in the Bangalow Church for this period and the church will be open each evening for people to come and enjoy. We also aim to have musical groups and choirs singing and playing Christmas Carols to add to the festivities. At this stage we have received a fantastic response from a range of groups who have accepted the invitation, including the CWA, Police Station, Bangalow Public School, Bangalow Men's Shed, Red Cross, Bangalow Koalas, Bangalow Anglican and Mirabelle Preschool, with hopefully more to join us. We see this as a great opportunity to serve our neighbours, through providing an opportunity to join together as community and celebrate at Christmas time. Our own Christmas tree is already being designed and planned. To help with this we would like to take a photo of each person that we will use to decorate the tree.
