In recent weeks we have continued on the path of discernment as we consider what God is leading us into as a congregation into the future. The Talking About Salt conversations have been an important part of reflecting upon where we are at as a congregation and who we are being called to be. Some phrases about our congregation that were captured during this time include:

- A faithful people seeking ways to represent Christ in life.
- A forgiving people, showing loving, positive actions and an open acceptance.
- Exploring how to share the Gospel and how to connect with the spirituality of people in our community.
- A justice-minded community with a heart to enact God's justice and hospitality.
- A community aware of the need to move into the future

These are reflections and summaries of who we are as a community and things that we value. It is helpful for us to be reminded of these things as we continue to minister to our local community in these days and especially as we seek the way ahead into the future.

In recent weeks some of our leaders have held discussions with people from the Byron Community Centre, Byron Shire Council, Wesley Mission and The Wayside Chapel as we explore ministry and mission to those who are struggling and disadvantaged in our own community, even on our own doorstep. Alongside this, a brave and creative group of our own people continue to meet regularly to seek ways to connect with our families and the younger generations in our community. These are tangible ways for us to ascertain where the needs are within our communities as we seek to serve and as we seek to share the Gospel in word and deed.

In the coming months we will engage in some focused mission planning facilitated by Rev Dr Cameron Eccleston from our Synod's Mission Enablement Team. This is an important step in the life of our congregation and I am encouraging all of our members, attenders and volunteers to participate in these sessions, so that together we can discern the way ahead. There may be times where we need to step out in faith, take risks and dare I say it change! This has always been the way throughout the history of God's people and wouldn't it be exciting to know that the reflections, planning, processes and discernment that we engage in during this season, may enable the continued sharing of the good news of Christ in word and deed in our community for generations to come.

May we be open to hearing the leading of God's Spirit in this season and may we all work together as we seek the way ahead into the future for our congregation.
