



## The end of a year...



With Advent just around the corner and beginning on Sunday 27th November, the Christian calendar year draws to an end this fortnight. The final Sunday of the Christian calendar year is recognised as Christ the King Sunday. I wonder what it means for you to recognise this? Kingship, monarchy and kingdom are words that hold such different meaning for so many people. This year following the passing of Queen Elizabeth II, the Commonwealth now has a new king, King Charles III and so these ideas may have

become more present in our thinking in recent months. This may continue into 2024 with another large royal occasion, the coronation, occurring. In our country it is obvious that there are a range of opinions that people hold about the monarchy and Australia's connection with it historically and into the future. For some, especially the indigenous people of our country, the ideas of kingship, kingdom and sovereignty are problematic and painful and for good reason, based on the results of this in history through dispossession, invasion and other effects of colonisation.

Yet in our Scriptures and on occasions like this, we acknowledge Christ as King and in so doing seek to explore what this might mean in our current context. In one sense it is a fitting way to end the Christian calendar year, by considering the kingship and lordship of Christ over all things. The opening chapter of Colossians has some wonderful things to say about this:

***“He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation, for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.” (Colossians 1:15-20)***

What a powerful passage about the nature of Jesus! I believe it is also helpful for us to remember that Jesus Christ is a king like no other. Jesus is the servant King, whose kingship is also marked by a humility that is modelled for us to seek after, as we choose to follow him.

So as this Christian year draws to a close and we move into a new one at the beginning of Advent, may we reflect upon what Christ as King means for us and in so doing prepare our hearts and minds for the journey of Advent, which culminates in the humble birth of this King, in a manger in Bethlehem.
