"From Generation To Generation - God meets us in our fear"

In Luke Chapter 1, when the angel Gabriel appears to Mary, she is perplexed, confused and no doubt, afraid. And yet, the angel's news is: "Do not be afraid." We hear this refrain all throughout the readings of the Christmas story. This is actually recognised as the most common phrase in the Bible. In fact, in quite a poetic way it occurs 365 times, once for every day of the year. As we engage in this journey through Advent, this is a wonderful reminder of our invitation to not be afraid. Despite the reality of the world around us and in our own personal experiences and circumstances, we are invited to trust in the

faithfulness of God and we remember this in the coming of Christ at Christmas time.

From generation to generation, God shows up in the midst of our fear and uncertainty and confusion. From generation to generation faithful people have said, "yes," to God, despite their circumstances, apprehension and fears. In Luke 1, we hear Mary's "yes" as she responds by saying:

"Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."- Luke 1:38

This is Mary's humble "yes" to the calling of God into the future. Perhaps the most remarkable annunciation in this passage, is not the messenger's revelation to Mary, but Mary's "yes" to the call. Mary's words have rung down through the centuries as a model of human response to God's unexpected calling and plan.

From generation to generation, our ancestors in faith have also accepted this invitation.

I wonder how we will respond to God's invitation in our days? As a congregation, we are exploring the way ahead in ministry and mission in our communities into the future. No doubt there will be times when we will be asked to make difficult decisions and explore change that may be uncomfortable. However, if we are to follow in the path of Mary's humble "yes," then we must also seek to respond to God's calling in a faithful manner, no matter how challenging it may appear at the time.

As you continue your Advent journey this year, may you remember that from generation to generation God meets us in our fear.
