

The Sermon on the Mount...

Over these few weeks during the season of Epiphany, we have been focusing on the early stages of Jesus' ministry as outlined in the Gospel of Matthew. The Gospel writer is keen to highlight that a focal point of Christ's ministry centres around announcing the good news:

'From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.'"- Matthew 4:17



This announcement of God's kingdom or reign is mentioned throughout the stories of Jesus' ministry and much of his teaching focuses on describing what this kingdom should and will be like. One of the prominent themes in this case, is the nature of this kingdom which is presented as counter cultural when compared to the kingdoms of Jesus' context and also when compared to the kingdoms, governments and systems of our contemporary times. Jesus presents a right-side up kingdom in an upside-down world, if you like, and in doing so shares teaching which is described by his contemporaries as authoritative and which also presents some serious challenges if it is to be lived out.

After announcing this kingdom in Matthew Chapter 4, Matthew Chapters 5-7 then present the core of Jesus' teaching, as he spends time with his disciples and the crowds who gather to hear this amazing teacher. We will be considering this section over the coming weeks in our worship gatherings. This teaching of Jesus in Matthew's Gospel has become known as the Sermon on the Mount, as the Gospel reveals Jesus going up a mountain (allusions to Moses' mountaintop experience in Exodus as he receives God's Ten Commandments are reflected clearly here), sitting down and teaching his disciples this important wisdom about God's Kingdom and how to live.

As we journey through this part of the New Testament we are invited to reflect on our understanding and engagement with the teaching of Christ and to consider how this might shape our own calling to ministry as individuals and as a congregation.

May you be challenged, surprised and inspired either for the first time, or in a new way, by the teachings of Jesus and his descriptions about the kingdom of heaven. May you also choose to engage in ministry, seeking to make things here on earth as it is in heaven. Grace & peace, Rev Phil
